

Results of the project “Epigraphic Lexicon of Dacia”, IDEI - PN-II-ID-PCE-2011-3-0412

5thOctober 2011- 4th October 2016

Phase 1.5thOctober – December 2011:

Team consolidation.

Sorting and gathering the bibliographic information.

Documentation in Romanian libraries (Cluj-Napoca, Bucuresti, Alba Iulia, Sibiu, Brasov).

Setting methodology.

Setting out standards for describing words in the lexicon.

Setting the basis for the development of two annexed chapters for gathering abbreviated structures and grammatical errors:

Litterae singulares (e.g. P.S.S.P – *pro salute suaposuit,-erunt*; V.S.L – *votumsolvit,-erunt libenter*);

Grammatica quaedam (language peculiarities, spelling errors, Greek influences, hypercorrections) (e.g. *pro se et suorum instead of pro se et suis* (CIL III 1068 = IDR III/5, 190), *vive instead of vivaे* (CIL III 1183 = IDR III/5, 480)).

Phase 2.Year 2012:

Mobilities of team members.

Achievement of a first draft of a part of the lexicon (200 pages).

Phase 3.Year 2013:

Words used in epigraphic material attested in Roman Dacia and published in corpora have been gathered and classified. Lectures using new interpretations related to different inscriptions have been reported and corrections have been made according to recent standards. 400 pages of the lexicon have been written.

Results of the research began to be loaded in the database.

Phase 4.Year 2014:

The epigraphic material was significantly enriched with new inscriptions coming from Dacia Porolissensis. These inscriptions, never before gathered in one corpus of documents, were provided to us by colleagues working on the publication of the *Inscriptions of Roman Dacia IV*.

In addition, each member of the team verified, corrected and completed his share of the data provided by the epigraphic source material. In the case of old and wrong readings of the inscriptions, corrections were made, respecting new and modern standards of lecture and interpretations. New language problems and errors were noted in the chapter (*Grammaticaquaedam*).

As research advanced, the database of the project was progressively loaded, new articles were inserted or new additions were made to the old entries already loaded in the previous year.

Phase 5. Year 2015:

The epigraphic material was further enriched with inscriptions from Dacia Porolissensis (mainly, Potaissa, Porolissum, Samum), that were not previously included in the lexicon. These inscriptions, never before gathered in one corpus of documents, were provided to us, as noted before, by colleagues working on the publication of the *Inscriptions of Roman Dacia IV*. New inscriptions, published in the latest volumes of *Année Epigraphique* (the latest being AE 2012), were also collected, analyzed and inserted in the lexicon. In addition, the epigraphic material already gathered was further verified, corrected and unified.

Within the grant PN-II-ID-PCE-2011-3-0412, "Epigraphic Lexicon of Dacia" **aMensa Rotunda EpigraphiaeDacicaePannonicaeque** was organized in Cluj-Napoca between 16 and 17 of October 2015. Phase 6. January –4th October 2016:

Editing and publishing of the volume ***Epigraphic Lexicon of Dacia, Mega Publishing House, 2016.***

During the editing of the lexicon, the epigraphic material already gathered was further reviewed, verified, and, if necessary, corrected. Some articles were rearranged in order to create a more coherent dictionary or were developed in order to offer readers richer and clearer information. The work thus resulted is useful not only to researchers, but also to students, offering data not only about the Latin and Greek language (morphological classes documented, cases or modes used preponderantly, etc. - see infra some examples of words) attested in Dacia, but also about historical, political, military, administrative, religious realities of the Roman Empire (see infra *mater*).
